#### II. Project Information

7. Project Goal:

The small town of Dickwella in the South of Sri Lanka is a predominately Sinhalese community. Only 5% of the community is comprised of Tamil-speaking Muslims. Of the 78 preschools in the area, only two cater specifically to the Tamil community. Classes at the Minhath Preschool are taught in the native language and children receive instruction in Arabic so they can read the Koran.

The preschool classes, which are based on the Montessori Education Model, include academics, art classes, performance events, and sports activities. The focus is sound education to the younger Tamil generation in Dickwella that maintains their cultural integrity while emphasizing social responsibility and fostering religious tolerance.

The Minhath Preschool building was built by RMF as a gift to the minority Muslim community in the area.

- Support the preschool with all the facilities that the children need for their education
- Implement special incentive programs for Tamil medium preschool teachers to develop their knowledge
- Expand the preschool building into a multi-purpose community center
- Financial support to maintain the school building and premises
- Financial support for the annual school programs/ events

- 10. Results and/or accomplishments achieved during this reporting period:
  - Aug 10<sup>th</sup>- School re-opened for 3<sup>rd</sup> term after one month Ramadan vacation.
  - Aug 12<sup>th</sup>- Held a parents meeting regarding the annual preschool trip; the date was set for the 23<sup>rd</sup>.
  - Aug 26<sup>th</sup>- Because of bad weather the trip was postponed and we went instead on the 26<sup>th</sup>. From Matara to Galle we travelled by train, which the children really enjoyed. Once in Galle we went to the harbor to watch the ships and we visited Koggala camp where the children enjoyed inside The Flight (restaurant). Then we went to one of the best children's parks in Habaradhuwa, complete with a swimming pool and indoor games. Afterward we went to Colombo Zoo and the children enjoyed some free time. In the late evening we toured the city by double decker bus. It was very special for our children to see the nighttime Colombo city lights. In short, the children couldn't stop talking about the bus trip for a long time.
  - Sep 28<sup>th</sup>- After the trip we worked on handicrafts because we held an exhibition on Sep 28<sup>th</sup>. Due to parents' request the exhibition was held on the 29<sup>th</sup> as well.
  - Oct 01<sup>st</sup>- Because of Children and Adults' Day we went to an adult nursing home with our children where we arranged to have the children give small gifts to adults who are in the home. After our visit to the home we went to the beach and the children learned how to fish with nets. The main reason we visited the adult home was to teach the children to emotionally respect the adults.
  - Dec 04<sup>th</sup>- We held a dress-rehearsal for the children's year-end concert.
  - Dec 06<sup>th</sup>- We had our year-end concert in the Montessori building.
- 11. Impact this project has on the community (who is benefiting and how):

The school has become a model preschool for the area and now the children of Tamil medium have the confidence in receiving a good education.

  - There is a no children park in our village so the children generally have the opportunity to enjoy their evening hours on our preschool grounds.
  - The higher grade students in Tamil medium who attend extra classes for specialized subjects; the classes are taught in the evenings and include subjects that are not offered in the public schools: Information technology and business studies.
